Through visual storytelling and quiet moments—a mother teaching gardening, families sharing meals—the film explores love, loss, and legacy. It showcases how the environment shapes identity, roots, and traditions passed through generations.

CLAUDINE (1974)

Claudine Price is a single mother raising six children in Harlem. Despite financial struggles, she works as a maid and remains committed to her family. The film emphasizes her strength and the realities of single motherhood, celebrating her unwavering love.

CROOKLYN (1994)

Centered around the Carmichael family in 1970s Brooklyn, the film is seen through young Troy's eyes. Her mother, Carolyn, is portrayed as the family's anchor, displaying warmth, wisdom, and sacrifices. It celebrates the joys and challenges of motherhood within a tight-knit community.

EARTH MAMA (2023)

Earth Mama blends ecoconsciousness with Black motherhood, following a single mother who transforms her care for her child into a fight for environmental justice. It shifts the conversation to include Black mothers' voices in global issues, portraying motherhood as activism. Through this intimate lens, the film showcases the universal power of individual change, driven by a mother's love for her child and community.





EVE'S BAYOU (1997)

Set in 1960s Louisiana, young Eve unravels family secrets while seeking comfort from her strong mother. The film explores the complexities of family, secrets, and the bond between mother and daughter, highlighting the impact of maternal love on a child's identity.

FENCES (2016)

Set in 1950s Pittsburgh, this film features Rose, a devoted wife and mother, who anchors her family through emotional challenges. As her husband's flaws unfold, her strength and love shine, embodying the sacrifices and resilience of mothers.

IN OUR MOTHER'S GARDEN

This documentary explores the lives of three generations of Black women within one family, reflecting on their experiences as mothers, daughters, and grandmothers. MISS JUNETEENTH (2020)

Turquoise Jones, a former beauty queen, pushes her daughter to enter the "Miss Juneteenth" pageant, hoping for a scholarship that could secure her future. Set in Texas, this heartfelt story explores themes of identity, family, and the pursuit of dreams amid adversity, celebrating Black women's resilience and sacrifices.





MISS VIRGINIA (2019)

Based on true events, this biographical drama follows Virginia Walden Ford, a single mother fighting for her son's education through school choice advocacy. The film highlights her perseverance in reforming education and igniting a grassroots movement, emphasizing the power of a mother's dedication.

STEEL MAGNOLIAS (2012)

This film centers on six women in a small Southern town, bonded by friendship and support as they navigate life's ups and downs. Set in a beauty salon, it explores themes of love, loss, and the power of female resilience, emphasizing sisterhood's beauty and strength.

TAKEN FROM ME: THE TIFFANY RUBIN STORY (2011)
